Malls, moonshine topics Sept. 25 at library

NEWTON—Catawba County Library in Newton will host first showings of three local history documentaries at 6 p.m. Friday, Sept. 25 when Catawba Valley Community College students exhibit their audio/visual projects.

“The topics covered should be of interest to local residents,” said Richard Griffin, Youth Services librarian at the Main Library.

Among the topics will be the migration of shoppers from Downtown Hickory to the malls, moonshining in Western North Carolina and comparing the experiences of area couples involved in WWII, Vietnam and the Gulf War.

The program should appeal to ages 12 and older. The public is cordially invited to the free showing.

The films are the result of a class taught recently by Richard Eller at CVCC. The class required students to present historical research through an audio/visual project.

The showing in Newton marks the second time that CVCC students have premiered their work at the county library this year.
