Training for Adoption Competency



Training for Adoption Competency (TAC) . . . A National Movement To Create an Adoption Competent Mental Health Workforce

The Center for Adoption Support & Education's Training for Adoption Competency (TAC) is an evidence-informed training program that provides professionals with the knowledge, skills and values they need to provide adoption competent mental health services



Training for Adoption Competency

- TAC is a 12-session (72 hours) competency based training program followed by a six month case consultation program for licensed mental health clinicians who provide pre and post adoption services to prospective adoptive parents, birth parents, adopted persons, and adoptive and kinship families
- 11 modules are classroom based, 1 module is completed at home
- Final class provide participants opportunity to integrate learning
- Each module combines information sharing, written handouts, resources, and experiential learning; including case studies, role plays and introspective work
- Six sessions of case consultation (one held monthly) follow the classroom training for licensed clinicians
- Manualized to ensure fidelity of the training program



What does the research say about the TAC?

- Program completers have superior performance on pre-/post-tests compared with a contrast group of non-TAC-trained clinicians
- Trainees have substantially improved performance on all core adoption competencies
- TAC learning is transferred to practice across six domains of clinical practice
- There are high levels of training delivery fidelity, quality and relevance

At the conclusion of the training, 88% of students report either having substantial understanding of the core competencies or having mastered the core competencies with the ability to explain to others.
