Catawba County Friends of the Library Annual Book Sale is This Week!

NEWTON – If you love books, the Main Library in Newton is the place to be this Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Friends of Catawba County Library will conduct its annual book sale Aug. 13-15, in the library's auditorium at 115 West C Street.

As in years past, the three-day sales frenzy will feature a members-only night on Thursday, August 13 (community members can join at the door to enjoy this first look), from 4 – 7 pm and sales to the public on both Friday (10 am – 4 pm) and Saturday (10 am – 2 pm).

The annual sale will consist of deleted library materials and donations from the public. Prices are \$1.50 for hardback books, 50 cents for paperbacks and \$2 for CDs and DVDs. On Saturday, bargain hunters are encouraged to bring bags to fill for \$3 each.

Friend of Catawba County Library will also be selling raffle tickets for a \$50 Bass Pro Shop gift card during the book sale. The drawing will take place on Saturday, August 15 at 1:45 pm at the book sale. Ticket holders do not have to be present to win.

The Friends group serves as a community liaison and support organization for the entire county library system which includes locations in Newton, Claremont, Conover, Maiden, St. Stephens, Sherrills Ford and Southwest. Annual Friends memberships will be sold at the door for \$10 per individual, \$15 per family and \$25 for businesses including booksellers.
