NOTE: I've been trying to put together the many sources describing particular family lines that I am descended from - with the hope of someday producing a book. Some of the sources are contradictory, or don't show references. So I often put it together, to be later challenged or proved. Please review the following and let me know if my theories are within reason. I hope that you find the document to be of some use to you in your own pursuit of research.

WARLICK FAMILY

1. Johann Daniel⁸ Warlick Sr¹. Born, circa 1710, in Germany. Died, circa 1772, in Lincoln Co, NC². Immigration: 19 Aug 1729, in Philadelphia, PA³.

"JOHAN DANIEL WARLOCK (WARLICK, WARLICH, WARLEIGH) arrived in this country on 19 August 1729 on the ship 'Morton House'. The name seems to be pronounced or spelled however one heard it. He first settled in the Trappe section of Pennsylvania, so referred to because of the Trappe Lutheran Church. This area was in Philadelphia Co. until 1784, now in Montgomery Co. About a month after his son DANIEL was born he purchased land in Oley Township which is in the present Berks Co. It is here where his first wife, MARIA MARGARETTA probably died. Many years ago someone who was helping me [Edwina Warlick Moore] with my research studied JOHAN DANIEL's deeds and plats and using a map tried to locate where the property was located. As near as he could tell, he thought it might have been in southeastern Berks Co. on the north side of the road from Pottstown to Reading, perhaps a little closer to Reading than to Pottstown. The highway, US 422 follows the north bank of the Schuylkill River between the two cities. His property must have been within a few miles of where DANIEL BOONE was born and where ABRAHAM LINCOLN's paternal ancestors lived." (E. W. Moore)

"Records in old Trappe church, Colledgeville, PA show that a son DANIEL was baptized, having been born 13 September 1738. The mother's name was given as MARIA MARGARETHA. The sponsors at the baptism were FREDRICH MARSTELLER, ANNA BARBARA MARSTELLER, and a son DANIEL MARSTELLER. And at the same old church the records state that DANIEL WARLICH was sponsor at the baptism of JOH. DANL, son of FREDRICH MARSTELLER, born 6 February, baptized 11 February 1733. The minister was Rev. JOHANN CASPAR STOVER." (J. W. Warlick)

It is tempting to think that MARIA MARGARETHA was a MARSTELLER, but family records in Germany and Pennsylvania do not, as yet, support that theory. (P. J. Rzeminski)

"It is said that his second wife was MARIA BARBARA SCHINDLER and that he married her in Northampton county PA, which adjoins Berks. That he was twice married is clearly established by a deed in Lincoln county when his son LEWIS WARLICK sold some land which was a portion of land that he had inherited from his full brother PHILLIP which proves that DANIEL Jr, NICHOLAS and VALENTINE were half-brothers of LEWIS. Under the law at the time half brothers did not inherit any share of PHILLIP's estate, nor sister whether half or full blood. DANIEL Jr, NICHOLAS, and VALENTINE were children by his first marriage to MARIA MARGARETTA." (E. W. Moore)

"About the year 1748-1749, along with what was at that time quite a migration of Germans and Swiss from Pennsylvania, he came into what is now Lincoln county, NC. The Colonial records of NC show that on 27 September 1750 when the Council of State was in session he was issued a total of five land grants totaling 2300 acres. Again on 28 March 1751 the Council of State was in session he was granted four grants totaling 2460 acres.

This would make his total royal grants 4760 acres. There were some added grants later." (Jesse W. Warlick)

"Since JOHAN DANIEL's first grants in North Carolina were in September 1750 and March 1751, he must have come to NC to take up land, leaving his family in Pennsylvania, not making the permanent move until the spring of 1753. He and his wife acknowledged a deed of sale in 1753. JOHAN DANIEL got a very good price for his property which indicates that he had improved it and was already becoming prosperous. What with additional grants and purchases in NC he became quite a large landowner, his lands being in both Lincoln and Berke counties. Even after deeding land to all of his children in 1769, he still owned a lot himself. He died a wealthy man as evidenced by the amount of the bond required when his son NICHOLAS was appointed to administer his estate." (E. W. Moore)

"In the year 1769 JOHAN DANIEL WARLICK and wife BARBARA deeded to children of JOHAN DANIEL WARLICK many tracts of land in Lincoln county and these deeds were practically all recorded in the year 1769. When JOHAN DANIEL died in 1772, his son NICHOLAS administered on the estate. Youngest son LEWIS was a minor and it seems no land was deeded to him; but in the same year NICHOLAS deeded from his allotment two tracts to LEWIS, spoken of as a magnanimous act. After JOHAN DANIEL's death it seems LEWIS stayed with his uncle HENRY HILDEBRAND, who it would seem married MARY ELIZABETH WARLICK." (J. W. Warlick)

From a 5 December 1940 newspaper article, Old Homes of Lincoln County and Interesting History Connected With Them, by Mrs. Lena R. Brown: ". . . Lincoln county was first named Tyron for the English governor but in 1779 was changed to Lincoln in honor of General BENJAMIN LINCOLN, who was a native of Hingham, Mass. Tyron county was created by the Colonial Assembly in 1768. In the year 1769, the Assembly appointed a number of substantial Commissioners to make contracts for building a court house. These Commissioners were THOMAS NEEL, HENRY CLARK, WILLIAM YANCEY, DANIEL WARLICK, JACOB FORNEY, JOHN GORDON, and WILLIAM WATSON. EZEKIEL POLK was the first clerk of court and JOHN TAGART was sheriff. ALEXANDER MARTIN was attorney for the Commissioners. Other attorneys were WAIGHTSTILL AVERY, JOHN QUINN, SAMUEL SPENCER and JOHN FORSYTH. The first sessions were held at the home of CHARLES McLEAN in 1769 to 1771. In 1772 at the home of CHRISTIAN REINHARDT and 1773 and 1774 at CHRISTIAN CARPENTER's. Records show that on 26 October 1767 King GEORGE the third, granted to MATTHEW FLOYD a tract of land containing fifty acres on which to build a school house and church. It was characteristic of the early German settlers that when the usual log house was completed they looked around for a location for a combination church and school house. On 15 July 1768 MATTHEW FLOYD conveyed to NICHOLAS WARLICK, FREDERICK WISE, URBAN ASHBANNER, PETER STATLER, PETER SUMMEY and PETER HAFNER, fifty acres for ten pounds sterling for a location.

DANIEL WARLICK and his wife, BARBARA SCHINDLER, with their family, were among the very early settlers in Lincoln county. He acquired much land and in a January Terms of Pleas of Quarter sessions ten deeds were recorded by him conveying lands to his children, a part of which is still owned by descendants. DANIEL build the corn mill in 1750 on the same site on which now stands the third one of its kind. The first one was burned by Indians and the second one was lost by fire during the Revolution."

He married⁴, first, Maria Margretha Marsteller?⁵, circa 1735. Died, circa 1745, in Oley Twp, Berks Co, PA. Children:

- i. ?⁹ Warlick⁶. Born, circa 1735, in Probably PA. Died, before 1800, in Lincoln Co, NC. She married⁶ Frederick Wise⁶, circa 1752.

"There is no positive proof and we have no given name for FREDERICK's wife. He was closely associated with the WARLICKs and he did receive land from DANIEL at the same time and same manner as the other known WARLICK sons-in-law, unmarried daughters, and the sons of DANIEL WARLICK. Researchers agree this has to be so, but no one can come up with a given name for FREDERICK's wife." (L. S. Eaker)

ii. Johann Daniel Warlick Jr⁷. Born, 13 Sep 1738, in PA. Died, circa 1759. "According to the traditions of the family, DANIEL Jr. joined a military expedition against the Indians in the West and was never heard of afterwards. Two of his brothers went in search of him, but were not able to ascertain his fate." (Judge David Schenek Book - Printed 1884)

v. Mary Magdalene Warlick⁸. Born, 1746, in Berks Co, NC. Died, 10 Oct 1818, in NC. Burial in NC⁹. She married¹⁰ David Ramsaur¹⁰, son of Hans Dietrich Ramsaur and Kadrina Ramsaur nee ?, 1759, in Lincoln Co, NC. She and her husband, DAVID RAMSAUR, are buried in the Tom Ramsour graveyard north of Lincolnton, NC (J. W. Warlick)

vi. Mary Elizabeth Warlick¹¹. Born, circa 1746, in Berks Co, PA. Died, after 1800, in Lincoln Co, NC¹². She married¹³ Henry Hildebrand Sr¹³, son of Hans Conradt Hildebrandt Jr and Elizabeth Kindig, 1769, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 27 Jul 1769, in Lincoln Co, NC.

He married⁸, second, Maria Barbara Schiendler¹, circa 1748. Born, 1720. Died, 1784.

"She outlived her husband, and after NICHOLAS was killed at the Battle of Ransours Mill, BARBARA was appointed substitute administrator. While her step- sons were Tories in the Revolutionary War, yet the records show she was cited for having given aid to the Whigs and was paid money from the Continental funds for the same." (J. W. Warlick)

". . . I must say that the question of being a Tory or Patriot [Whig] within the German culture of Old Lincoln Co., and elsewhere for that matter cannot be answered with 'he was' or 'he wasn't', with few exceptions. In NICHOLAS' and PHILLIP's case, they lost their life early in the conflict. In most cases, allegiance swung on a pendulum as to which warring faction was the greatest threat to life, limb, & property. It was mostly a case of 'when' they were a Tory, not 'if'. . . Here again one must understand that the German people had taken oath of allegiance to the King of England upon entering the New World. A german and his oaths were not easily parted. Most tried to remain neutral. . . other another. As descendants of this German settlement, I've often wondered what our choice would be if faced with the same decisions in our time." (L. S. Eaker) Children:

vii. Phillip Daniel Warlick¹⁴. Born, 1748, in Berks Co, PA. Died, 20 Jun 1780, in Lincolnton, NC. He was a British Tory who was killed at the Battle of Ramsour's Mill.

viii. Eve Catherine Warlick⁸. Born, 20 Feb 1749/0, in Berks Co, PA. Died, 24 Jan 1822. She married¹⁵, first, Martin Shuford¹⁶, son of Johannes Shuford and Mary Clare Conrad, circa 1769, in Lincoln Co, NC. She married¹⁷, second, Jacob Summey¹⁷, after 1780.

ix. Elizabeth Barbara Warlick⁸. Born, 17 Jan 1754, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, 17 Jun 1806⁹. She married¹⁸ Christian Reinhardt Sr¹⁹, son of Daniel Reinhardt and Charlotte Reinhardt nee ?, 1770, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 27 Jul 1770, in Lincoln Co, NC.

x. Maria Barbara Warlick⁸. Born, 1756, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, 14 Feb 1826. She married²⁰ Thomas Hoover¹, 1773, in Lincoln Co, NC. In January 1773, CHRISTOPHER RINEHART was appointed guardian of BARBARA WARLICK.

xi. Loudowick "Lewis" Warlick.

2. Capt. Johann Nicholas⁹ Warlick (Johann Daniel Sr, 1)¹⁴. Born, circa 1740, in Berks Co, PA. Died, 20 Jun 1780, in Lincoln Co, NC. He was a Tory Captain [British] who was killed at the Battle at Ramsaur's Mill. (R. C. Carpenter)

He married¹⁴ Barbara Eaker¹⁴, circa 1770. Born, 1749, in Lancaster Co, PA. Died, after 1801, in Lincoln Co, NC. Baptism: 23 Dec 1749, in Lancaster Co, PA. Children:

3. Valentine⁹ Warlick (Johann Daniel Sr, 1)⁸. Born, circa 1744, in Berks Co, PA. Died, circa 1787, in York Co, SC.

"There has come a question as to the parentage of DAVID, ABSOLAM, JOHN, DANIEL AND BARBARA their sister, who married MICHAEL SCHENCK. In the family history of SCHENCK, it is stated that BARBARA WARLICK was raised by her aunt EVE CATHERINE WARLICK who married MARTIN SHUFORD first. He was killed in the Revolutionary War. She married second JACOB SUMMEY. Now there is a statement that the parents of the above children were VALENTINE WARLICK who married CATHERINE WHISANANT and according to what ALFRED WARLICK wrote in his WARLICK family book, VALENTINE and his wife separated on account of her having taken the American side against the British during the Revolution. Said that VALENTINE died in Georgia near Cartersville, GA." (L. L. Word)

He married²³ Eva Catherine Whisnant²⁴, circa 1776, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 18 Feb 1774, in Lincoln Co, NC. Born, 30 Oct 1746, in Lancaster, PA. Children:

- i. John¹⁰ Warlick²⁵. Born, 14 Oct 1774, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, 20 Jul 1861, in Lincoln Co, NC. He married²⁶, first, Mary Harmon²⁶, 1794, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 13 Mar 1794, in Lincoln Co, NC. He married²⁶, second, Mary Davis²⁶, 1814, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 22 Nov 1814, in Lincoln Co, NC. He married²⁶, third, Lydia Reynolds²⁶, 1828, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 14 Feb 1828, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- ii. Daniel Warlick²⁵. Born, 1775. Died, 17 Mar 1841. He married²⁶ Mary Whisenhunt²⁶.
- iii. David Warlick¹⁷. Born, 7 Jan 1777. Died, 28 Jul 1850. He married¹⁷ Dicey Crowder²⁵. He is buried in the Mt. Zion Church Cemetery, Cleveland Co, NC. (L. W. Word)
- iv. Barbara Warlick²⁵. Born, 10 Aug 1782, in SC or NC. Died, 23 Aug 1815, in Lincoln Co, NC. She married²⁶ Michael Schenck Jr²⁶, 1801, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 11 May 1801, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- v. Absalom Warlick¹⁷. Born, May 1785, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, Feb 1873, in Cleveland Co, NC. He married²⁵ Sarah Crowder²⁵, circa 1806.

4. Loudowick "Lewis"⁹ Warlick (Johann Daniel Sr, 1)²⁷. Born, 12 Jul 1763, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, 14 May 1834, in Lincoln Co, NC. In January 1773, HENRY HILDEBRAND was made guardian of LOUDOWICK (LEWIS) WARLICK, orphan son of DANIEL WARLICK.

He married²⁸ Mary Hoyle³, daughter of John Hoyle and Margaret Costner, circa 1785, in Lincoln Co, NC. Born, 5 Apr 1767, in Lincoln Co, NC. Died, 5 Apr 1838, in Lincoln Co, NC. Children:

- i. Solomon¹⁰ Warlick. Born, 5 Dec 1791. Died, 13 May 1881. He married Barbara Warlick²⁹, 1817, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 20 Aug 1817, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- ii. David D. Warlick. Born, circa 1792. He married Rachel Seitz, 1827, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 10 Dec 1827, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- iii. John Warlick³⁰. Born, circa 1794. Died, 12 Aug 1864. He married Elizabeth Baker, 1819, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 30 Apr 1819, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- iv. Daniel Warlick. Born, circa 1795. Died, circa 1865. He married Katherine Smith³⁰, daughter of Peter Smith and Hannah Bess, 1812, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 28 Oct 1812, in Lincoln Co, NC.

- v. Philip Warlick. Born, 1 Jan 1797. Died, 24 Jan 1878. He married Sarah Baker³⁰, 1824, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 21 Oct 1824, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- vi. Peter Warlick. Born, 10 Feb 1801. Died, 12 Sep 1877. He married Katherine Shuford³⁰, daughter of Philip Shuford and Anna "Ollie" Abernathy, 1826, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 12 Jan 1826, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- vii. Margaret Warlick. Born, circa 1803. She married³⁰ Martin Shuford Jr³⁰, son of Martin Shuford and Eve Catherine Warlick, 1818, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 23 Feb 1818, in Lincoln Co, NC.
- viii. Barbara Warlick. Born, circa 1805. She married³⁰, first, John Link, 1828, in Lincoln Co, NC. Mar License, 10 Apr 1828, in Lincoln Co, NC. She married³⁰, second, Eli Rowe³⁰. She married³⁰, third, Harry Suttlemyre³⁰.

5. Daniel¹⁰ Warlick (Capt. Johann Nicholas, 2)¹⁷. Born, 12 Aug 1771. Died, 14 Aug 1816. Burial in Lincoln Co, NC.

He married¹⁷ Margaret Ramsaur³¹, daughter of Jacob Ramsaur and Anne Carpenter. Born, 16 Oct 1777. Died, 31 Jan 1872. Children:

Seek more information on G.M. McCoy. He is buried next to Jane McCoy. Her stone reads born April 26, 1829 died April 1, 1911, wife of G.M. McCoy. His tombstone is broken in half with the top half missing. I have checked for cemetery records but none are available. I wonder if G.M. McCoy is the father of James Clinton McCoy and seek his birth and death dates.
