WIC AWARDED GRANT FUNDING

The Catawba County Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program was awarded \$33,000 in grant funding to enhance operations, create a more positive breastfeeding environment, and support a welcoming climate for our clients.

Funds will be used for infrastructure changes like new computers, counter tops, and education stations in the lobby, as well as updating the breastfeeding room and promoting breastfeeding-positive images throughout the office. New WIC advertisements will also be released on Greenway buses throughout the year.

NACO RECOGNITION

Catawba County Public Health and Catawba Family Dentistry were recently honored with a National Association of Counties (NACo) award for the Childhood Oral Health Project (CHOP), which uses a navigator to connect families using Women, Infants and Children (WIC) services to dental services offered at Catawba Family Care. It was recently expanded to also include women receiving prenatal care at Catawba Valley Medical Center - Maternity Services.

After receiving the award, NACo reached out to write a case study on the program and has scheduled a webinar on August 30 featuring the program's success.

Rhonda Stikeleather, Children's Services Nursing Supervisor, will be one of four speakers in the webinar and will share information on how CHOP started in Catawba County and the impact it has had on our clients and community.

NATIONAL FARMERS MARKET WEEK

The Public Health Farmers Market celebrated National Farmers Market Week August 5-11. The week is a way for markets to promote their impact on the physical health (better nutrition), mental health (positive relationships) and economic health (financial impact) of communities.

As of the end of July, there have been 2,994 farmers market vouchers issued to Catawba County WIC participants. As of the August 6, 2018, market, customers redeemed:

- » 1,352 WIC Farmers Market Vouchers
- » 262 Bonus Bucks
- » \$221 in SNAP benefits



The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program recently updated its client survey and results have been coming in steadily. Here are some of the survey results highlights:

» The top 3 places that clients heard about WIC:

» 84% of surveyed WIC clients report that they are very likely to make healthier food/nutrition choices for their family because of their visit to WIC.
