The eldest daughter, Ann Fay, is given a set of overalls and instructions by her dad to be the "man of the house" while he's away – a daunting task for any child, made especially difficult when the frightening

polio epidemic strikes. In the face of tragedy, Ann Fay discovers her resourcefulness and her ability to move forward amid seemingly insurmountable challenges. 
