

Priya Palmer has handed the financial reins of FOSFTL to Glenn Madara, longtime Friends member. We asked him for his "take" on library matters:



After marriage and the birth of three children the decision was made to raise the family elsewhere. It was 1991 when we all moved to a home outside of Charlotte.


