

As our Summer Learning program draws to a close this month, we are excited to celebrate the nearly 2,000 kids, teens, and adults who participated. We are also looking forward to the new school year and preparing to get all geared up to start the year ready to learn and positioned to succeed.

As a leader in early literacy efforts to ensure children start school ready to learn and positioned to excel, the library provides parents and caregivers resources, services, and programs to enhance early learning from day one. This includes Every Child Ready to Read storytimes and caregiver workshops at our library locations and in the community. Each of our locations have a designated children's area complete with books, interactive learning toys, and literacy based computers just for children. The library has also expanded early literacy spaces outside the library walls with a Family Literacy Center at CleanWave Laundry in Long View, and Literacy Trails where visitors to Murray's Mill, Bunker Hill Covered Bridge, St. Stephens Park or Bakers Mountain Park can enjoy nature while they follow along with the pages of a To support Catawba County educational initiatives, including K64, the library maintains responsive partnerships with Catawba County's school systems and higher education institutions to support student learning through collaborative services and programming that provide learning opportunities for children and young adults to explore and discover career paths. Past and current partnerships include a book lending program for preschools, art show exhibits, Literacy & STEM

parent nights, and volunteer opportunities for high school students. Through NC Live, the library provides students, families, and teachers access to online resources for research, language learning, and test preparation and practice.

To further our efforts to support educational excellence in Catawba County, the library is participating in United Way's Stuff the Bus campaign. All library locations will be collecting school supplies and hygiene products for the month of August. School supplies needed are:

3-ring binders, backpacks, composition books, spiral notebooks, graph paper, notebook paper (college and regular rule),

pens, pencils, glue sticks, erasers, folders, crayons, colored pencils, earbuds, rulers, markers, scissors, pencil boxes, Ziplock bags (sandwich, quart, gallon), composition books. Hygiene products needed are: Kleenex, cleaning wipes, hand sanitizer, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, feminine hygiene products. All donations will be taken to United Way for dispersal between all three local public school districts — Catawba County Schools, Hickory Public Schools, and Newton-Conover City Schools.
