

The Elementary-school Reading Team Adds a Third School



The First Grade Literacy team is ready for action! We are excited to add a third school to our rotation. This year will be reading with first graders at Sherrills Ford, Balls Creek and Catawba Elementary schools. We plan to visit these 3 schools four times this year and bring the joy of reading to over 200 students. We will be reading at Balls Creek at the end of September and with the other two schools in October.

On each visit, our volunteers go into the classroom to read a chosen book with the class. After reading and engaging the students with the story, the children will have fun completing an activity related to the book. At the conclusion of the visit, a copy of the

book will be donated to each first grade classroom and each student will receive a personal bookmark to remember our visit.

In our first book of the year, <u>The Tallest House on the Street</u> by Stephanie Moss, we find a giraffe who is looking for a new home, closer to her friends. She struggles to find one tall enough—until her friends come to her aid. What would we do without our friends?

Friendly Krafts-4-Kids Begins Its Second Year

One of the most popular FOSFTL programs is a constant challenge to the Krafts Kommittee, but they never seem to be at a loss! This month's offering is certainly timely—the hay is being baled, the soybeans are ready to harvest, and apples are abundant!



Barbara MacArthur cooked up the latest kraft—a do-it-yourself apple, complete with its own worm! The books linked to this kraft are both entertaining and educational. The Apple Orchard Riddle features a trip to a farm (ecology); What's an Apple? looks at the apple up close and personal (imagination). Red Panda's Candy Apples puts him in a sticky situation (social relations), and Apples to Oregon goes back to the time of the Oregon Trail (history).

Joining Sue Green, Barbara MacArthur, and Kathy Bradham on the FOSFTL Friendly Krafts-4-Kids Kommittee is a new volunteer—Joanne Sobolewski. Her help is certainly welcome!

Report from the August 8th Strategic Planning Meeting

The annual strategic planning meeting convened on August 8 to discuss long-term issues and goals for the Friends of the Library.

One of the agenda items was joining the Friends of North Carolina Libraries, a statewide network of local FOL organizations. Membership would give us access to resources for various library programs along with awareness of current issues affecting



libraries. The organization also gives awards and grants to Friends organizations for specific initiatives. The yearly membership is \$35. We will vote on joining at our September business meeting.

Next we talked about forming an advocacy committee, as presented at our April business meeting when Lynda Reynolds from the Friends of North Carolina Libraries joined us. Currently, Emily Huling is working on forming such a committee, which will be called the Community Relations Committee. Members will work to build awareness of the FOL and the library within the committee, will advocate for funding and other

support from local and state government, and will foster relationships with other local organizations. In case you missed it, an email about the Community Relations Committee went out on August 21.

One of the ideas shared at the planning meeting was assembling birthday cake kits for folks in the community. If you like this idea, consider joining the program committee or the community relations committee and make it happen!

We also discussed several new program ideas, which were then shared with the Program Committee. Examples include developing an adult literacy program in the form of a community read or classics book club. We also talked about ideas that could double as publicity for the FOSFTL, such as distributing tote bags with our organization name printed on them.

Finally, we talked about the budget, specifically how our funds are distributed among various accounts to maximize interest, and how we will renew efforts to build an outdoor gathering space at our library. More on that at the September business meeting.
