

NEW SPACES & FACES



The Catawba County Library has been awarded a federal grant to install five soundproof office spaces and high quality video conferencing technology at the Main Library in Newton for community members needing a quiet space to participate in online education, telehealth, employment, court system proceedings, tutoring, and library programming.

Nicknamed Oasis Spaces, these fully enclosed booths are designed with three layers of soundproofing material, creating a truly private space where people can hold meetings, interviews, or counseling sessions without fear of being overheard or disturbing others.

The library is partnering with NC Works to provide workforce development services to the community using the Oasis Spaces as a private consultation area. The library is also partnering with Kintegra Behavioral Health to promote the Oasis Spaces as an ideal location to use for telehealth visits.

The library will install two single booths, perfect for one person making phone calls, video conferencing, or performing focused tasks. There will also be three larger double units, ideal for meetings and work sessions for up to four users. The double units, will each be equipped with a computer, camera and mic to facilitate and simplify teleconferencing for users. For those using the single units, the library will provide access to laptop computers with teleconferencing abilities.

In the role of Community Navigator, Midori is most excited about getting to connect with community members, learning more about local agencies and resources, working closer to home, and being able to contribute to the community that has "given so much to myself and my family".


