NEW LIBRARY SERVICES

The library is thrilled to announce the addition of fantastic, free resources, including free online access to newspapers and free faxing service.

The library is subscribing to a newspaper streaming service called NewsBank which provides access to hundreds of newspapers from around the country including full-color editions of the Charlotte Observer, and the Hickory Daily Record. Library patrons can use their library card to access these new resources from home on their own device or from the library. NewsBank provides a comprehensive collection of reliable news sources covering a wide array of topics and issues. Explore and stay informed on local and national topics, people, and events in areas such as business, health, education, jobs and careers, political and social issues, and more.

Library staff are ready to help patrons get comfortable with the new process and access the newspapers of their choice from anywhere. To get started on your own, please visit www.catawbacountync.gov/library and click on Read Newspapers Online. With thousands to choose from, including foreign language newspapers, patrons can access full-color editions of their favorite newspaper. NewsBank offers read aloud features and citations for research purposes.



The library will continue to provide the print version of the Observer News Enterprise and Wall Street Journal for branches already getting those papers, and will continue to archive the Observer News Enterprise and Hickory Daily Record for genealogy and local history use.

The library is also excited to introduce a new, free faxing service that allows community members to confidently send faxes securely. Known as Faxcore, this online fax service is HIPPA-compliant and available at all seven library locations, complementing the existing capability to scan documents and images to email free of charge.

The library is also proud to provide access to NC Legal forms and free notary services. These invaluable resources equip individuals with the tools they need to navigate important legal matters, all at no cost. NC Legal forms can be accessed at the library or from home, and our notary service is available at several locations—please call for an appointment.

Of course, the library is still your go-to destination for books, audiobooks, movies, magazines, and so much more.

The library's mission is to empower lives and build community by bringing people, information, and ideas together. This is a significant step towards empowerment, providing access to a service that may have been difficult to obtain otherwise.
