

PRE-K STEAM

FOR OUR YOUNGEST LEARNERS



The Catawba County Library is launching a new Pre-K STEAM program focused on nurturing critical thinking, problem-solving, and creativity in the minds of our future innovators.

It is important to introduce our youngest learners to the wonders of STEAM education in a tangible, hands-on, and screen-free manner. To facilitate this, the library is assembling two sets of interactive Pre-K STEAM tools to circulate throughout the system, providing librarians with the resources for dynamic play-based learning. Each month Pre-K STEAM programs will be held at conveniently located branches across the county, giving families the opportunity to engage in these enriching activities on a weekly basis.

These tools will also be available for parent-led or independent exploration outside of program time, fostering a passion for learning and deepening parentchild engagement. Each set includes various tools, from light tables and wind tunnels to age-appropriate robots, building blocks, magnifying glasses, and more.

At the core of the library's approach lie the principles of the evidence-based Every Child Ready to Read early literacy initiative. Library locations will deliver engaging and interactive STEAM activities while modeling to caregivers how to nurture their child's critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Library staff will set up a space with centers and serve as knowledgeable guides, providing instructions to caregivers, prompting them to facilitate purposeful interactions that ignite critical thinking and problem-solving in the children.

For children, the objective is to gain foundational skills and cultivate confidence and resilience in the face of challenges in a low-risk play environment. For parents and caregivers, the objective is to empower them with essential strategies and methods to continue kindling their child's curiosity beyond the library's walls.

With the addition of Pre-K STEAM to the library's robust schedule of storytimes and programs for children, the library is elevating our capacity to provide young learners with dynamic and engaging educational experiences that lay the groundwork for lifelong learning.




