Who's calling in the woods at night? Travel with a little girl and her dad as they walk through the woods in search of a mysterious nighttime bird. What will they see during their search?

Kathy Bradham has assembled a charming Snowy Owl Handprint project. It contains the pattern and directions to create a "snowy" owl using cotton balls and a child's handprints for wings. Supplies needed to complete this craft include scissors, a glue stick, black and orange crayons or markers, white construction

paper, cotton balls and the owl template. (Adult supervision may be needed

with the use of scissors.)
