

Heartfelt thanks to Sherrills Ford Elementary School, Balls Creek Elementary, and Catawba Elementary for allowing us to share our love of reading to inspire early readers to read, learn, and be creative.

Thank you for bringing your passion to every classroom and to each child. We engaged with 245 students in fifteen classrooms four times this school year!

The activity that accompanied the book was for the students to write their dreams on clouds and draw a picture surrounding them. A sample of the activity is projected on a screen. From shooting three pointers to being an archeologist, each student had a moment to imagine their future. It was fun to see how their writing and spelling skills have improved throughout the year. A copy of the book is donated to each classroom and each student receives a personal bookmark to remember our visit.


One Last Book for the Second Graders This Year


This is a story which encourages kindness and curiosity. It emphasizes the need to keep trying and to never give up as we make decisions.

The Newton Library Introduces "Oasis Spaces"

The telephone booth may have gone the way of the dinosaur, but the "office booth" is its direct descendant! Late last year, the Catawba County Library System finished the installation of five state-of-the-art "Oasis Spaces" at the Main Library in Newton. Thanks to a federal grant and the NC Dept. of Library Services and Cultural Resources, these specialized soundproof office spaces,

complete with high-quality video conferencing technology, are available for the community to use for private and virtual meeting needs. Library Director Siobhan Loendorf "has been thrilled to hear how helpful these spaces have been for community members."

There are two single booths, with access to laptop computers with teleconferencing capabilities, and three double booths, each equipped with a computer, camera and microphone to facilitate seamless teleconferencing.

Oasis Spaces join current meeting and study room spaces located at the Sherrills Ford-Terrell, St. Stephens, and Southwest Branch Libraries.

The library is also partnering with Kintegra Behavioral Health to promote the Oasis Spaces for use in telehealth visits.

Legislative Day Hosted by the Catawba County Library System

Emily Huling and Erica Batten attended the "Legislative Day in the District," hosted by the library system, on April 10th. Held at the main library in Newton, the event showcased the library's programs and

resources, many of which are available on rotation or loan to all members.

An example is the children's STEM toys — a lighted table with transparencies of animals and plants to explore, a wind tunnel, and a robot bee that teaches simple programming. Emily and Erica got to check out these toys for themselves. What's more, the STEM toys will be on rotation at our branch in May, just in time for Family Fun Day.

If you haven't been to the Newton branch, go! Not only is it a beautiful facility, but it has several resources that make it a community destination. System director Siobhan Loendorf was recently awarded a state Library Services and Technology grant toward the purchase of five tiny meeting rooms (featured on Page 6). These are quiet single- and double-occupancy spaces where patrons can work, tutor, attend a Zoom meeting, have a telehealth session, or just enjoy some quiet. Each has a computer, a monitor, and a camera. Loendorf said the pods have about 40 decibel sound attenuation. "So you can hear the fire alarm go off, but you can't really hear the buzz of people talking outside the booth." The library also has a digital makerspace with a 3D printer, a seed library, and the indispensable history archives.

Large-Format Printer Brings the Solar Eclipse Indoors

Erica Batten used the large-format printer (donated by FOSFTL) to make this creative display.

She attached it to a posterboard and used it as a photo prop for an eclipse viewing and listening party. Erica works for the Metrolina Association for the Blind, which hosted an Eclipse Party on April 8th at the Eastway Recreation Center in Charlotte. That poster brought the eclipse much closer to earth!
