Our Members-only Private Tour of the Hickory of Art Museum

The Program Committee has arranged another interesting outing for 2024! Like last year, the Hickory Art Museum will open its doors at 2:00 only to us, and Friends will have a special treat. Last year there were many arrangements made for lunch and other auxiliary stops in Hickory and the day was memorable!

Along with the curated *objets d'art* on display, there will be an exhibition of an original and unique artist's works: the multi-media works of **Michael C. Thorpe**.

Thorpe is a former college-basketball-

MVP-turned-textile artist, a combination of skills and insights one isn't likely to encounter again!

In stitching and printed canvas and in playful pencil and stitched drawings, Thorpe explores the visual connections of his background.

Thorpe came to quilting as an artistic vehicle connecting him to his bi-racial background. Quilting is a skill passed on intergenerationally by the matriarchs of Thorpe's family who were part of the quilting community in New England.

Thorpe's subsequent discovery of the Gee's Bend community of African-American women quilters in Alabama offered the artist deeper personal meaning in his chosen medium and a connection to his African-American heritage.


Nellie Ashford: Honoring Women & Children.

Meet Nellie Ashford, a native of Charlotte, North Carolina, is a folk artist whose work expresses cultural identity, shared community values and aesthetics. Inspired by the life that surrounds her and memories of her past, Ashford's work tells rich stories of her experiences, ranging from her memories of growing up in the South during the Jim Crow era to depictions of contemporary events. Combining painting and

collage, she often celebrates the unsung members of her community: children and teachers, artists, parents, musicians, and religious figures. Although she has enjoyed making art throughout her life,



Nellie Ashford really hit her stride in her 50's. Since then, she has received accolades for exhibitions of her work at the Levine Museum of The New South, the Harvey B. Gantt center for African American Arts and Culture, and The Mint Museum.



Ashford was also awarded a major commission for the



new terminal at Charlotte Douglas International Airport.

On Saturday, November 2 from 3 - 5 PM Hickory Museum of Art will hold a Meet the Artist Reception presented in conjunction with this exhibit.

In Good Night Owl, by Greg Pizzoli, Owl tries his best to wrap



Poll Workers Needed for Upcoming Election

The Catawba County Board of Elections is looking for individuals to be poll workers in the upcoming election especially in the Sherrills Ford Area. Workers are needed for Early Voting (October 17-November 2) and Election Day (November 5). This is a paid position.

There are staggered schedules for Early Voting. On Election Day you must available to work 13-14 hours without leaving the precinct and for several hours the day before the election. There will be a 2-to-3-hour training session prior to the beginning of voting that you must attend.



Some of the requirements are you should be able to read and write accurately, follow directions, work at a fast pace and lift up to 25 lbs and be proficient in using a computer (using a mouse, data lookup, printing, etc.)

A Major Expenditure of FOSFTL Funds Approved



For many years, it has been hoped that a modification of the outside space could be made by the FOSFTL for the library. Much research has been performed and many roadblocks were encountered. However, after a review this past year, it has been determined that hardscape proposals for the library are not feasible. Past fundraising for this project has left funds available for use.

SFT Library has requested the purchase of Kodo Kids Sand & Water Comprehensive kits, Kodo

Kids Light Laboratory, Main Street Kiosk, and additional funds for future requests and teen/adult equipment/resources. After review of the proposed budget at the June 18th meeting, the contribution of these requested funds to the SFT Library was approved by unanimous vote.


