

On September 16th, Friends of the Sherrill Ford-Terrell Library enjoyed an afternoon full of fellowship, culture and history. Nine of us met for lunch at Gepetto's in Hickory and enjoyed catching up with each other. Afterwards we headed over to the HMA for a private tour, led by **Associate Director Clarissa Starnes**, who opened our eyes, hearts and minds.

We visited permanent displays as well as the three main exhibits, which included **NO EXPECTATIONS**, by artist Michael C Thorpe, **WOMEN and CHILDREN**, by artist Nellie Ashford and a photography exhibit, **EXPOSING FORM**, by Harold "Doc" Edgerton. Clarissa brought each exhibit to life as she told us about the artist, their technique and shared anecdotal stories about their art. These exhibits will be on display until mid-November 2024. Through Michael C Thorpe's work with textiles, we appreciated his resilience and NO EXPECTATIONS approach to life. The exhibition

explored the interconnectedness of Thorpe's passions—the creative process and basketball. Thorpe's multimedia works combine painting, drawing, and stichery—all talents that connect him to his family and to his past.

We travelled through time with Nellie Ashford's collage -style paintings as she captures memories of growing up in the Charlotte area. Her work expresses cultural identity, shared community values and aesthetics.

Combining painting and collage, she often celebrates the unsung members of her community: children and teachers, artists, parents, musicians, and religious figures. A Meet the Artists Reception will be held at the HMA on Saturday, November 2, from 3-5 PM.



Harold "Doc" Edgerton (1903-1990), artist and engineer, was a pioneer in the field of high-speed photography. This exhibition of photographs from the museum's collection highlights the captured movements of sports activities such as golf, tennis, diving, acrobatics, jumping rope, running, and more. Also known as "Papa Flash," Edgerton invented the strobe light in the 1930's while on the faculty of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

Advocacy/Community Outreach Program Makes Its First "Housecall"

The houses begin built all around Sherrills Ford and Terrell will soon shelter a

population entirely new to our area. Many of the homes are already sold, and home buyers are being tempted by prospects on Sherrills Ford Road, on Molly's Backbone Road, all around Terrell and continuing down Slanting Bridge Road. New housing developments adjoining the library and nearby are already seeing incoming residents.

The Advocacy Committee sees this growing population as an invitation to US, the FOSFTL, to make ourselves known, and to advertise the resources available at our library. The first Home Agents contacted were very much interested in letting their prospective buyers know how close the library was

A Grand Opening was recently held at the Laurelbrook development on Molly's Backbone Road, directly opposite the new SFT fire stationhouse. Committee member **Joyce O'Neal** set up a table with the FOSFTL banner prominently displayed and greeted attendees from 11:00 to 2:00 PM. Informational materials supplied by Shelley Orr were handed out and several parents stated that they were already bringing their little ones to Storytimes at the library.

More agents will be contacted in the future, and a pamphlet is planned to condense the library's and the FOSFTL's information.

Joyce O'Neal returns to the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library on November 14th to present her eighth solo piano recital for the community. Beginning at 6:30 p.m., Joyce will present a wide variety of musical subjects and styles, from a worshipful chorale prelude by Bach to the romantic genius of Tchaikovsky. Explorations of melody (called "inventions") will compare J.S. Bach (1720) to Ulysses S. Kay (1946). A Chopin nocturne will precede a set of wild variations by Norman Dello Joio. Franz Liszt's lovely musical description of Switzerland should relax you and then Sergei Rachmaninoff will round off the program with characteristic dramatic flair.


