



Author Austin Allran and Publisher Patty Thompson Coming to Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library January 21st



The Friends of the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library will present a program featuring an author and his publisher on January 21, 7:00 PM in the community room. Author **Austin Allran** will discuss his recently published book, <u>The Legend of the Isle of Cats</u>, and describe his experience as a writer. **Patty Thompson**, from Redhawk Publications, will provide insights into the world of editing and publishing.

Books will be for sale at the event, and checks will be accepted. A Friends **member-only Meet and Greet** with Austin and Patty will be held before the program from 6:15 pm to 6:45 pm. Austin Allran is a writer, attorney and elected official who has written numerous short stories, poems and newspaper articles.

<u>The Legend of the Isle of Cats</u> is his first novel. He has received awards from the NC Writers' Network for a short story and the Hugh T. Lefler Award for a historical biography. Austin is currently serving as a Catawba County Commissioner. He has also served 3 terms in the North Carolina House and 14 terms in the North Carolina Senate. He is a life-long resident of Hickory, North Carolina.

Patricia (Patty) Thompson is the acquisition editor at Redhawk Publications, a creative initiative of Catawba Valley Community College in Hickory, NC. In this role she evaluates manuscripts from authors, negotiates author contracts, shepherds accepted titles through the publishing pipeline and creates book-launch marketing strategies. In the four years she's been with Redhawk, she's worked with over 100 authors and overseen the publishing of nearly 175 books. Patty is not only an outspoken advocate of the literary arts, but she champions all artistic endeavors and proudly serves as the President for Arts Culture Catawba, formerly known as the United Arts Council of Catawba County.


that our event was well-attended.




















Emily Huling and Charlene Callahan Read for 15 Elementary Classrooms




