Jennifer will focus on Balls Creek Campground, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, and has been the site of annual Methodist camp meetings since 1853.

Old St. Paul's Lutheran, dating to 1818, is also on the National Register. On the outskirts of Newton, its 613 acres encompass a cemetery centuries old.






# March's Friendly-Krafts-4-Kids Kan Shake Hands with Itself—Several Times!


**Sue Green** has linked this kreative kreature kraft with three delightful books—all available in the Catawba County library system:


- 1) My Mommy the Octopus, by Wendy Gerber;

students in **15 classrooms** in Sherrills Ford, Catawba, and Balls Creek elementary schools celebrate Valentine's Day week AND the 100th day of the school year!

The children were excited to learn that *papillon* is a French word that means *butterfly*.

Papillon, the kitty, is so light he floats. Miss Tilly tries everything to help Papillon stay grounded. Finally, it's a birdhouse hat that his feathered friend, a red bird, can live in and keep Papillon safe and secure.

Each student decorated a foam visor with stickers to be reminded of Papillon's story of friendship and helping each other. FOSFTL supplies craft materials.

And spring is nearly here—so is spring cleaning! Perhaps you can make a little space on those shelves and keep our programs going forward!




# Author Tommy Tomlinson Returns To Sherrills Ford-Terrell on April 29th with his New Book, <u>Dogland:</u>

### "Passion, Glory, and Lots of Slobber at the Westminster Dog Show"!

Tommy Tomlinson presented a fascinating program for FOSFTL several years ago when

his book, <u>The Elephant in the Room</u> (a memoir about being overweight in America) was published. His latest book, <u>Dogland</u>, promises just as much humor—and insight—as his first. The paperback version will be released on April 8th.

He has written for publications including *Esquire*, *ESPN* the *Magazine*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Forbes*, *Garden & Gun*, and many others. He spent twenty-three years as a reporter and local columnist for the *Charlotte Observer*, where he was a finalist for the 2005 Pulitzer Prize in commentary. His stories have been chosen twice for the Best American Sports Writing series (2012 and 2015) and he also appears in the anthology *America's Best Newspaper Writing*. He teaches magazine writing at Wake Fores University and has taught at colleges, workshops,



and conferences across the country. Our April program will be held at Rehobeth Family Life Center (starting at 7:00 p.m.) to accommodate the large crowd he is sure to draw!


