Why Does Summer Learning Matter?

The Northwest Evaluation Association (a non-profit founded in 1977 and acquired by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt in 2023) has conducted studies on the "summer slide" since the 1970's. A recent collection of studies in the last six years provides a fresh look at students' learning challenges during the summer.

These studies show that on average, test scores flatten or drop during the summer, with larger drops in math than in reading. During the summer of 2022, an estimated 90% of school districts surveyed offered summer programs with an academic focus. The lengths of the programs varied, as did the percentages of student attendance, but a summary of the results reinforced the idea that any summer learning program can show results if implemented on a consistent basis.

From 1998 to 2011, a synthesis of the different evaluative surveys showed that for K-8 students, teacher—or parent-directed summer literacy lessons delivered significant improvement on multiple reading outcomes. Within-study comparisons indicated that summer reading interventions had significantly larger benefits for children from low-income backgrounds than for children from a mix of income backgrounds.

SFT Library Summer Learning Numbers Exceed Expectations

Shelley Orr, Library Services Manager, attended the FOSFTL business meeting on June 17th and announced the our library has overwhelmingly exceeded its sign-up goals for the Summer Learning Program.

As of June 17th (and with the sign-up deadline still in the future), 241 children are planning to participate, greatly exceeding the goal of 175! There were also 36 teens and 158 adults signed up at that time.

The growth in these numbers reflects the added interest in the library generated by our increasing population and especially reflects the commitment and energy exhibited EVERY DAY by the library staff.

FOSFTL will again host an Ice Cream Social on August 8th from 3-5 p.m. to reward the children who meet their Summer Learning reading goals.

In addition, Shelley announced that the SFT Library remains the model for the county with 93 children signed up for the "1000 Books Before Kindergarten" program.

The increased attendance at the library's Storytime programs has resulted in the addition of another Storytime, this one on Fridays!


