WITH DECODABLE BOOKS

The Library is excited to announce the launch of a new collection* of over 700 decodable books—a powerful tool to help children practice phonics and grow into confident readers. **Decodable books** are an important accessory for children to practice and strengthen their reading skills. They are like training wheels for young readers—when a child learns a new letter sound, these books give them a way to practice that sound in words and stories they can read. Each success gives children a sense of achievement and the motivation to keep

going, helping them build

fluency, confidence, and a

love of reading.

The library's new collection includes nine different series of decodable books, giving children more choices while they strengthen their reading skills. Research has shown that a structured, phonicsbased approach helps every child become a successful reader, even those with learning differences such as dyslexia.

This new print collection is available now at all seven Catawba County Library locations. Decodable books are meant to be read alongside other children's literature so each child can experience new vocabulary and sentence structures. Library staff at each
