



NECK


MEASURE AROUND THE BASE OF THE THICKEST PART OF YOUR NECK

MEASURE FROM THE CROTCH SEAM TO THE BOTTOM HEM

First-Grade Literacy Kicks Off the 2025-26 Year

<u>Fiona Helps a Friend</u> was the perfect book to kick off our 2025-26 First Grade Literacy program. The 280+ students in 16 classrooms in Sherrills Ford, Catawba, and Balls Creek elementary schools loved the book and the accompanying craft.

Fiona, a hippo, is based on the real-life Fiona in the Cincinnati Zoo. The book's Fiona recruits her zoo animal friends to cheer up another friend, Matilda, a sad Kookaburra. Luckily, the animals find a Lost and Found box full of crazy items, so the

animals have a dress-up party and get Matilda to laugh.

Author and illustrator Richard Cowdrey beautifully captures the personalities and antics of the zoo animals—this makes the book come alive for the students.

Each student created a paper bag Fiona puppet after our volunteers read the book. FOSFTL supplies craft materials and **Charlene Callahan** prepared the craft kits. A copy of the book is donated to each classroom, and each student receives a personal bookmark to remember the book and our visit.

Our reading team for our October reading included Colette Suntum, Debbie Brignoli, Beth DeMauro, Catherine Webb, and Emily Huling. We love to share our love of reading!






Second-grade Literacy Team Roars into 2025-26 Action

FOSFTL's Second-grade Literacy Team roared into the 2025-2026 school year by reading <u>Brave Like Me: A Story About Finding Your Courage</u>, by Christine Peck and Mags Deroma, to over 160 students at Sherrills Ford and Catawba Elementary Schools.

Brave Like Me is the story of Wyatt, a lion well known for facing scary things and situations with boldness. But when Wyatt's friend Pip invites him to participate in a talent show, Wyatt hesitates to answer. Pip's hat suddenly flies away on a gust of wind and Wyatt immediately goes on a trek to retrieve the hat. It lands on the talent show stage, which Wyatt is emboldened to enter by the "clap, clap, clap"




of the encouraging audience. Wyatt overcomes his fear of performing and struts his stuff.

This book shows that one way we face our fears is by having a greater desire to help someone else. And the encouragement of others helps build our confidence and willingness to try new things.

Check any opportunities below that catch your eye—we'll be in touch! Teens may be eligible to earn school volunteer hours.

Officer Roles – Serve as President, Vice President, Treasurer, or Secretary (2-year term)
Nominating Committee – Help identify and recruit qualified Officers and Board Members during election cycles and as vacancies arise
Fundraising Committee – Develop and support fundraising strategies and create campaigns that support the library's programs and goals
Book Bonanza Committee – Ensure a steady supply of books for our sales by assisting with book collection, sorting, and inventory management
Family Holiday Event – Assist with planning and/or helping on the day of our December celebration
Literacy Program – Support early literacy by selecting books, assembling reading packets, or reading in classrooms (Grades 1–2)
Community Advocacy Committee – Promote the library and its programs, and build community support
Membership Committee – Support member outreach, renewals, thank-you emails, and event table staffing
Program Committee – Collaborate with the library to brainstorm, plan, and run programs and events
Refreshments/Roadies Team – Provide and serve refreshments, and assist with event setup/cleanup
Publicity Committee – Coordinate and expand publicity efforts
Art Show Committee – Coordinate collection, library display, and return of student artwork to local schools
Little Free Library Committee – Help stock and maintain Little Free Libraries throughout the community and track any needed kiosk repairs
Friendly Krafts 4 Kids Committee – Create and organize literacy-themed "Take and Make" craft kits for young library patrons
