INTRODUCING CAROLYN SMITH

COMMUNITY NAVIGATOR

The Catawba County Library welcomes Carolyn Smith, a student from the Appalachian State University Department of Social Work who will be working at the Main Library in Newton as a Community Navigator this semester. Each week, Carolyn will work Monday through Thursday, reaching out to individuals who may need help figuring out how to get connected to various assistance programs in our area. She will play a crucial role in strengthening our communities by working with local organizations to expand access and reach more people, especially those in more vulnerable populations.

The Community Navigator program was established in August 2020 after the library observed a substantial increase in the number of people seeking help to complete hiring paperwork, apply for stimulus checks, and print proof of eligibility for support. In helping individuals, library staff observed that these tasks can be very complicated and frustrating for everyone. Hence the need for community navigators, someone with a thorough understanding of all the resources in the community agencies, churches, shelters, organizations and what they have to offer, eligibility requirements, whom to talk to, when to visit, if an appointment is needed, how to apply, and required documents.

Last year over 2,000 people in Catawba County reached out to NC 211, an online information and referral service provided by the United Way of North Carolina. Community navigators serve as an in-person 211 assistance helping people figure out what is available to them and how to obtain it.

Carolyn is excited to pick up where last year's interns left off and has already begun the work, meeting people, assessing their most immediate needs, and referring them to community resources when possible. She says "I try to be good at listening and it helps when meeting people from all walks of life. I look forward to talking to people, encouraging and helping them through the process. Connecting people to whatever they need is the most important thing that I can do." Carolyn is taking time to visit local agencies to meet providers and learn about all the different services they offer, so that she can help smooth the way for those in need. Acting as a personal guide, Carolyn will help level the playing field for disadvantaged individuals and work to eliminate barriers to service by steering vulnerable people to available resources more quickly and efficiently. When a person is in crisis mode they are already stressed and even the smallest task such as typing in a website or making a phone call can seem insurmountable. By having a Community Navigator who can provide empathy and understanding, and who can help guide individuals to making more informed decisions about their own situations, the library can help increase that person's opportunity to succeed.

This project allows the library to strengthen our capacity to connect people to essential resources and to empower library staff to provide exceptional programs and services. It expands our community's access to resources for learning and success in school, work, and life by engaging in a deeper

and more meaningful way to meet patrons in need where they are without judgment or stigma.
