FREE WI-FI SERVICES EXTENDED

It's easier than ever to get online! Find out how we can help you apply for jobs, pay bills, do homework, check email, do research, see a doctor via telehealth, and more!

In October 2020, the Catawba County Library expanded free access to broadband Internet within the county, thanks to an NC CARES grant awarded by the State Library of North

Carolina. The funds allowed for the purchase of 53 Wi-Fi-enabled tablets for lending and the establishment of free Wi-Fi access points at seven partner locations.



We're thrilled to announce that the benefits of our initiatives have been recognized and we've received additional funding to continue bridging the digital divide through July 2022!

The library's broadband project supports all Catawba County residents, including school children, people in the workforce, employers, and health care patients. As a result, more people in underserved neighborhoods now have critical access to the information highway, empowering them to make more informed decisions about their own situations and to have improved opportunities to succeed.

The library's 53 Samsung tablets are equipped with internal Wi-Fi capabilities, meaning that borrowers can check out a single device and automatically connect to the Internet. No separate hotspot is needed, and multiple devices can be connected to the tablet's Wi-Fi signal for broader household access. The tablets are pre-loaded with a set of user-friendly apps, and they offer unlimited data on a 4G network. They may be checked out for two weeks at a time.

To tap into the network's signal, simply pull up the Wi-Fi settings on your smartphone or device. When the 'Wi-Fi for All' option appears, select it to log on. You'll need to click 'OK' on a landing page to continue, but no password is needed.

The Catawba County Library's grant is among 45 awards the State Library recently announced, totaling nearly \$1.6 million. The awards support local library projects that target high-need communities to address digital inclusion, expand digital network access, purchase Internet-accessible devices, provide related technical support in response to the coronavirus, and support community needs.




