

RIBBON CUTTING-LIBRARY LOCKER


HELP US CELEBRATE!

We are so excited to announce the Catawba County Library is putting the finishing touches on our **LIBRARY PICK UP LOCKER!** The locker is located at **CLEANWAYE LAUNDRY HICKORY** in **LONG VIEW**, allowing us to expand our services all across the county! We would love for you to celebrate with us and experience the full effect the pick up locker and our partnership with Cleanwave Laundry is making in the Longview community!

Providing convenient, free access to empowering library resources seven days a week, this new self-service locker system will allow people to browse a selection of books to check out or pick up books placed on hold from the library's online catalog. The system has a total of 34 lockers that can hold multiple books, audiobooks, or DVDs. Ten of the lockers will have a clear window where people can browse and check out specially selected bundles of items. All of these resources are available for free with a Catawba County LIBRARY CARD, available at any location or online at www.catawbacountync.gov/library.

The library locker is the newest resource available in Long View thanks to the ongoing partnership with the owners of Cleanwave Laundry. Along with the library locker, CleanWave Laundry generously provides free Wi-Fi, charging stations, a small collection of children's books, several tables and seating areas during their regular operating hours.

The library will also provide two laptop computers that can be borrowed from Cleanwave staff for use inside the laundromat. This centralized location is also a monthly stop for the **LIBRARY TO GO** mobile unit, working to connect people to empowering library services. These include story times, STEAM, health and wellness, technology, and workforce development programs. This month the Library to Go will be at Cleanwave Laundry on Monday, January 10th for the ribbon cutting event and on Sunday, January 16th from 2-5 pm for its monthly stop.

The Library Locker furthers the library's mission to **CONNECT, EXPLORE, AND GROW** by bringing library services and resources outside the walls of the traditional library to meet our community where they are. Having this locker will allow children and families to more easily access high quality reading materials and participate in reading programs, including the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten and Summer Reading programs. The Librarian from the Library to Go will provide expert help with technology, resumes, applications and job searches, building people's confidence to pursue their goals.
