At this time, I would like to acknowledge several members who have already graciously agreed to assume Chair positions and to thank their predecessors for their dedicated service:

Sabine Detzel recently assumed the role of Membership Chair to coincide with the start of our annual membership drive. New member Tammy Hallman has volunteered to replace long-standing Literacy Program Co-Chair Meg Thompson and will oversee the second-grade literacy program. Meg has led the second-grade initiative for many years, and we are so very grateful for her stewardship of- and devotion to- this wonderful program.

Volunteers are still needed in several key areas:

May 17th and 18th felt like a glorious return to normal as we welcomed Diane Chamberlain to Sherrills Ford-Terrell. This event proved to be just as popular as was expected, with response so

strong that both dates saw the Community Room full of fans.

Main Street Books in Davidson sent a representative to both gatherings, and sales

of Ms. Chamberlain's latest novel, <u>The Last House on the Street</u>, were brisk. So another goal of the FOSFTL, supporting independent book stores, was met.

The best-selling author entertained the audience with the story of her journey from novice to veteran, being most careful not to give away the endings of her previous books, and induced lots of laughs on the way.

Ms. Chamberlain is at an age when many of us retire to the front porch or the garden, but she is still challenged by the prospect of new works (although

she promises fewer books at longer intervals!) Her personal interaction with the characters she has created is striking; she recounted imagining her first novel at a young age and carrying the story for many years in her memory.

Both audiences had many pertinent questions, as well as comments on their own emotional responses to her books. We hope she enjoys many more years of creative story-telling!

Activities for children, teens,




and adults will include presentations by the North Carolina Aquarium, the Hickory Music Factory, the Green Bean Players, and Catawba County Parks.


Friendly Krafts4Kids Acquires Permanent Status as a FOSFTL Offering

Our Summer Baskets Are "In the Pink"

The saying dates all the way back to the 16th century, when pink wasn't used to describe a color—it was a flower!

The flowers we call Sweet Williams (dianthus) are still referred to by the Brits as "pinks." The dianthus got that nickname because its blooms looked like small eyes, or "pinck oogen" in Danish. The British imported the flower along with its (transliterated) nickname. Pinks were considered the pinnacle of floral design and thus referred to a peak quality, so "in the pink" meant to be in the peak of health. All this is a roundabout way of saying that our Basket Sales are moving right along, although there is still a wide selection out on the table, waiting for you! So remember when you need a "pick me up" for a friend or relative—pick up one of our "in the pink" baskets!
