


## & Storytelling Ace, Kyra Freeman

## A History of Our Elementary School Literacy Programs

Our Friends of the Library literacy program has been connecting elementary school students to great books for more than 15 years. With grant funds from the Catawba Valley Community Foundation, the program launched in 2005 for first-graders at Sherrills Ford Elementary School. The next year, more grant funding allowed the program to be extended to second-graders. By 2007, the program expanded again, this time to Catawba Elementary, but without grant money. That's when the Friends of the Library stepped up to provide all of the funding for the program. Since then, the literacy program has been offered to first-and second-graders at Sherrills Ford and Catawba.

All this background information is courtesy of Barbara Nelson, a.k.a. "The Bag Lady." A retired teacher, Barbara was one of the original volunteers with the literacy program. About once a month (more on that later) she would visit a first-grade classroom, armed with a new book. The aim of the program, as Barbara puts it, is to "connect the library, school, and home."

"Each class has the book read aloud to the class as a whole," Barbara said. "Afterwards, each child gets to take the bag with the book, journal, markers, and stuffed animal home to share and read with his or her parent. The next day the bag comes back to school for another child to take home."

Before the volunteers began making their visits each year, the Sherrills Ford branch librarian would visit the schools to tell them about the summer reading program and to teach the children how to get library cards. She would also make bookmarks for each child to keep when they took the bag home. The bookmarks had a list of other library books related to the one they had read.

After the bag had made its rounds to each child's home--which took a month or two--it was time for the volunteers to return with a new book. Soon the children began to anticipate this visit.

"The bag lady is coming!" the children would say as Barbara entered the classroom. "Yes, the bag lady is here!" she replied.

Now Barbara has passed the title of "bag lady" on to new volunteers. Starting this school year, Emily Huling and Charlene Callahan will lead the first-grade program.

"They're both very excited, and I feel very comfortable passing this program on to them," Barbara said.

## SFTFOL Resumes the First Grade Literacy Program After a 2-year "Pandemic Pause"


**Back to School!** Co- coordinators, Emily Huling and Charlene Callahan will be headed to Sherrills Ford Elementary School at the end of September and to Catawba

Elementary School in October to resume The First Grade Literacy program. They are excited to be invited back into the classroom after a two year pause.



This program strengthens the bond between school, home and the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library with the hopes of sparking a love of reading in each child. During the visit, our volunteers read a story to each class and provide a correlating activity to engage the students with the story. After each visit, a copy of the chosen book is donated to each classroom library and also to the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library. In addition, each child is given a colorful bookmark to remember the book, as well as an accompanying letter to the parents explaining our program.

Our first book is called Kiss Me, by Melanie Joyce. This heartwarming story illustrates the many obstacles young children face and how a gentle kiss can take your worries away. Emily and Charlene plan to visit both schools 4 times this year. This program is funded by the generosity of the Friends of the Sherrills Ford-Terrell Library.


