### Greetings from the President

### Greetings Friends,

Nineteenth-century British educator Charlotte Mason observed, "Everyone likes knowledge best in literary form." Today, we might substitute the word "narrative" for "literary," but it's nevertheless true; we interpret the world through stories. So what a delight it was to explore the spooky with a real-life storyteller in October. If you attended our Spooky Stories program with Kyra Freeman, you were treated to nightmarish tales of cats and mermaids along with a modern twist on the classic hitchhiker ghost yarn. And be sure to attend our History of Sherrills Ford-Terrell program in January and our Normandy Remembers program in March for great real-life stories.

So why do we like stories so much? Of course, they're easier to remember—and a lot more satisfying—than a random string of facts. It's also satisfying when you can weave together a narrative of your own: the love story of your life; the story of how you got *here*; the story that makes you laugh uncontrollably, or cry just a little. Our organization is sharing such stories with the community through our elementary school reading programs, (by the way, the first-grade program is looking for more volunteers!), through our support of the library's literacy programs, and through Friendly Krafts-4-Kids that encourage kids to read. In October, we launched our art contest for the Little Free Library box that will be installed at Mountain Creek Park. All these efforts, and more, help us share the gift of stories—of knowledge—with our neighbors.

We also like stories because they have setbacks: conflicts that take creativity, resilience, courage—and, often, friendship—to overcome. We can see ourselves embodied in the noble characters who face these challenges, and we strive to be like them. The Friends have experienced some challenges this year. We've lost members, past and current, who were key to building the organization and the library itself. We mourn the loss of Susan Hunsucker's husband, Glenn, who died in September; we have also recently learned of the death of longtime member Barbara Turowski. We have had to reconfigure our holiday offerings and continue to shore up membership in the wake of COVID.

I invite you to be part of *our* story—as a main character, or in a strong supporting role. We will have a regular business meeting in November to share what "chapters" we've "written" thus far. Join us, and help shape the story of the Friends.

## The Realm of Scare!!





### What Would You Wish For?


That's the question the First Grade Literacy program readers will be asking the children during the FOSFTL's second book reading this school year.

The FOSFTL Literacy Program's goal is to spark a love of reading in each child. In addition to Sherrills Ford Elementary School's four first-grade classrooms, Balls Creek's six first-grade classrooms have been added to the program. 194 young and curious minds are benefiting from our onsite book reading, which also includes a pencil and paper creativity exercise. Students take home their artwork, a colorful bookmark, and a letter to parents about the FOSFTL organization.

Charlene Callahan and Jaimie Selepec have finished this month's Kraft; which is linked to the perennial favorite, The Cat in the Hat.


Sue Green also reports that "she is designing extra projects for the holiday season, featuring other iconic books by


